Designation: Core Requirement for All Layreaders

Overview

The Prayers of the People are the response of the community to the proclamation of the word. The Prayers of the People provide a time of intercession and public prayer in worship using a well defined sequence while covering specific content. They are also an initial step in a commitment to action. The movement of the Prayers of the People is from the world and the universal Church, to local churches and community, to individual and personal needs. While there is a wide variety in actual use, traditionally the elements of the petitions and thanksgiving are:

- The Church Universal, its members, and its mission
- The welfare of the world (including current events)
- The Nation and leaders in authority
- The concerns of the local community
- Those who suffer, are in any trouble, or have immediate need
- The departed Fathers and Mothers of the Faith

NOTE: Although this course provides a variety of examples of preparing Prayers of the People, it is the layreaders responsibility to follow and adhere to the preferences and advice of the clergy in charge of the parish in which they are licensed when writing and delivering prayers.

Objectives

- 2. Describe the core structure of prayers of the people.
- 3. Know where to find resources to help develop prayers of the people.
- 4. Understand how to adapt litanies to add original content or write original prayers.
